# **T** Painting leads to reunion

WHEN veteran Steve Butterworth was asked to paint the First World War battleship HMS Euryalus he ended up reuniting a daughter with her father's former comrade.

Steve presented his painting to The Fusilier Museum in Bury in time for the centenary celebrations of the Gallipoli Campaign.

Steve, a Falkland Islands navy veteran, is VIC's outreach worker in Rochdale, Heywood and Middleton, and he is also a member of the VIC art group along with Pat Rothwell.

Steve said: "I mentioned to Pat where I was going and she explained her father James Hart had been a Petty officer on the Second World War HMS Euryalus.

"It is unusual for a battleship to be affiliated with an army regiment but in the Gallipoli Campaign some of the crew from Euryalus rowed the soldiers to shore and then ended up fighting alongside them on the beaches.

"I took the picture to be signed by members of the HMS Euryalus Association and the oldest member, 91year-old John Kay Scott, signed it. It was a great privilege.

"It turns out that John served on the light cruiser of the same name during the Second World War along with Pat's father and they got the chance to meet and Pat was invited to join the parade on Sunday as a family member." Pat said: "I took along photographs and John remembered serving alongside my dad. I also showed them a brass plague I have of the ship's crest.

"I got an invitation to South Shields to the commemorations, because that is the ship's adopted town."

When VIC held an art display and shop in Bury last summer, ex-Fusilier standard bearer Steve Fitt had a stand to promote the museum.

On seeing Steve's work he asked him to create a picture of the HMS Euryalus.

The first painting was raffled and raised £260 for the museum and the Fusiliers' Association; the second painting will be on permanent display in the museum.

# Art shop opens to support CCH

ARTISTS will soon be able to get everything they need from paper to paints, pastels to pencils at a new shop being opened by Veterans In Communities.

The charity, based in Haslingden, is planning to open a shop next month in Rawtenstall in the Positive Start building on Queen's Square gyratory.

Arts and crafts co-ordinator Darren Horsnell, a Falklands veteran who discovered the therapeutic properties of art while at Combat Stress, said: "The shop is to be called the Positive Art Shop and will hopefully open in June, once we finalise the lease.

"It will be a retail art shop selling a wide range of different materials and media and the shop will be manned by volunteers from VIC's art group.

"The volunteers will also be creating artwork in the shop while they are running it and will be available to discuss their work with the shoppers.

"All the money that we raise will benefit the Creative Community Hub, which we received funding for from the Armed Forces Community Covenant.

"This will enable us to take our art out of the VIC Centre and into the community"

The shop plan would not have been possible without the help, support and partnership working between VIC and Positive Start. It is hoped the project will prove to be viable and sustainable and will benefit both charities.

It is planned to open the shop Thursdays to Saturdays 9am to 5pm and on Sundays from 10am to 2pm.

Monthly workshops will also be held in the shop so artists can learn new skills.

Although the Positive Art Shop is not a VIC outreach, veterans or their families calling will be signposted to the outreach facility nearest to where they live.
