Film premiere at Alder Grange

RETURN, Belong Prosper - the VIC documentary short film was premiered at AG6 in Rossendale and then seen in Preston by delegates at a regional conference.

The film, follows the story of three members of VIC and the difficulties they faced when transitioning from military to civilian life and how art has helped them

Outreach Worker Steve Butterworth, ex-Navy, along with Army veterans Dave Jodrell and Volunteer Arts and Crafts Co-ordinator Darren Horsnell, speak openly in the film that they codirected with researchers from Anglian Ruskin University.

At AG6, Mayors from Rossendale, Accrington and Burnley were in attendance. along with Armed Forces Champions, Military veterans, police officers and civilians.

Chief Executive Amanda Walton said: "I would like to say thank you to the staff at Alder Grange, the students

and cadet force members; what they did for us was phenomenal. I hope everyone who attended

Police Inspector Jim Jones was also present, the Greater Manchester Police Force's Tactical Lead for the Armed Forces Covenant. He was awarded the British Empire Medal in 2022 for services to policing and the Armed Forces.

Also present was former policeman Russ Magnall. from Safe and Sound Training and Coaching.

Operations Manager Bob Elliott said: "We got excellent feedback from people who watched the film."

At Westleigh Conference Centre, Preston, the film got a further public viewing before around 150 delegates at the Lancashire and South Cumbria Armed Forces Conference organised by

Lancashire.

Bob said: "The event was split into different sessions, firstly about the Armed Forces Covenant then education where we heard from researchers and students carrying out research projects.


"Health and housing was discussed in the afternoon and VIC featured within health. We showed the film and Amanda gave a presentation along with Dr Nick Caddick.

"When the film was shown, you could have heard a pin drop as everyone was silent and many people came up to us afterwards and said how good it was."

As the film progresses, a mural is being created in the background, and it is only complete once the film finishes, the last touches are made to the mural; which is on a back wall in the art room at the VIC Centre.

Amanda said: "When we finished I had lots of delegates coming up to me to say how good the film was and that it showed the excellent work being carried out by VIC and the difference that it is making to the lives of veterans."

Bob and Amanda said they particularly enjoyed a presentation by the British Thoroughbred Retraining Centre at Whinney Hill Farm CIC, Lancaster.

AFTER serving VIC well since 2014, our original minibus has now been replaced by a fantastic new model again provided by David Fishwick Minibus Sales in Colne.

The bus has been adapted for practical use for VIC by David Fishwick's and liveried with logos and slogans.

Operations Manager Bob Elliott said: "We picked up our new VIC minibus from Fishwick's. As they supplied our last one, it was it was no brainer for us to go back again.

"As with the last one, it has had similar modifications; an awning, tow hook, rear seats removed for an enclosed rear storage section and fittings to put the flags up for shows and events."

As the charity knew the original minibus would need replacing, money has been set aside



each year.

Bob said: "Although it's been reliable and a good old workhorse, it was time to replace it for something newer and more comfortable for the social trips we arrange for our members and when we go out to events."

The day after VIC took delivery, the bus was taking veterans on a social outing to Samlesbury Hall.

It will also be used for the VIC VE-Day 80 French tour in September.
