I VIC making a difference

COMMUNITY projects in Colne, Loveclough and Haslingden have been completed this month.

VIC members have finished work at Dave Fishwick's Minibus Sales where we rebuilt a wall and painted railings.

We responded to an inquiry from an amateur First World War researcher who found a neglected Commonwealth War Grave covered with mould.

Anne King contacted VIC to say: "It's the first time I have seen a CWGC covered in green mould.

"I'm sure it's because it is in a more or less forgotten cemetery on the

outskirts of Rossendale.

"I just wondered if you guys knew about it and if you could perhaps tidy it up?"

When VIC attended they found six graves of First World War soldiers.

Volunteer worker Bill Ogden, who completed the work with Mick, said: "We have cleaned up all the six graves. We have done our best to remove the discolouration as a result of being positioned under trees.

"We also cut back the tree lines to ensure that all six graves are now easily accessible.

"The idea now is to try and get the

local primary school involved to ensure they are not permitted to get in such a state in the future.

"In the meantime I will try to visit once a year and give them a tidy."

Manager Bob Elliott said: "We have also just completed work on a community project at Westbourne sheltered accommodation in Haslingden to create raised beds for the residents to use.

"We are now looking for more community projects for our veterans to undertake. If you have a project you need help with please contact 01706 833180."

WE GOT the chance to race go-karts against a number of injured veterans from Kartforce, celebrities and other teams.

The Harley Street Skin Clinic organised the sponsored event Back on Track to raise money for Kartforce and injured troops.

Two lucky VIC members former military musician Peter Webster and Tony Stubbs, who served in the Kings Own Royal Border Regiment, got to take part.

They travelled to the Daytona Race Track at Sandown Park, Esher, Surrey.

Peter said: "It was an absolutely fantastic day and I went down with my son Lewis who is 15 and he loved it too. The adrenaline rush was amazing. All of your problems went away when you were on the race track

"There was a team from Top Gear and The Stig was on the track at the same as me and I passed him twice."

Tony said: "It was a pleasure being invited and meeting other veterans and also meeting celebrities and also racing against each other.

"There was a beautiful atmosphere where the celebrities got involved with the race and when we crashed in to each other. Everyone was brilliant and they were nice people. I will never forget that day."



the teams got to race for 30 minutes and were then called in to the pits to switch drivers.

The races were run according to Formula 1 rules and both Tony and Peter found themselves in the 'sin bin' when they passed a kart that had spun.

Peter added: "The karts went up to 55mph and when I was doing my laps it started raining making the track harder to drive on.

"I took one corner at 55mph and I crashed and spun the kart through 360 degrees three times and bounced off the tyre wall. I was fine and so I just carried on racing.

"We came 14th out of the 24 teams that took part, which was fantastic and I definitely want to do it again."

Manager Bob Elliott said: "We have been invited back and will continue to work with Kartforce in the future. Dave Player, the founder of Kartforce, has offered ideas and support for our members to get more experience.

"There is a track in Manchester and we are looking at putting our own team in next time."
