Graham's stepping out

MILLION-step walker veteran Graham Limb has already completed more than half of the total and he is not even half-way through his eight-week challenge.

He has also smashed his fundraising target of $\pounds500$ for Mind, the mental health charity, and VIC – currently it stands at $\pounds644.20$,

Graham joined the Royal Artillery at an early age and struggled to adjust to civilian life. When he saw what was happening in Croatia with ethnic cleansing, he fought against the Serbs and then joined the French Foreign Legion before becoming a firefighter on returning to the UK. His career was cut short after a devastating house fire

where children died. The pandemic left Graham struggling to leave his Haslingden home, so he took

up walking again, then the VIC car park marshalling of the vaccination hub at Rawtenstall gave him a purpose.

When the marshalling stopped, he decided to take up the million-step challenge.

Graham said: "I am now hoping to get to 1,000km in the eight weeks, although I realise I may also break that total.

1,000 mile challenge







TWO special sunflower plaques have been installed on the car park sign next to VIC in memory of two of our members who are sadly missed by all.

It was a shock to everyone when we unexpectedly lost Carole Mills at the end of 2019 and that sadness was compounded when Tracey Vick lost her brave battle with cancer last September.

Both ladies are very fondly remembered by all VIC members and the Rossendale Hospice plaques are a fitting tribute.

VETERAN Gordon Aaron set himself a huge 1,000-mile walking challenge for 2021, but he is set to finish it in August.

Pensioner Gordon, 85, from Milnrow, ran for the Army while completing his National Service with the Border Regiment in his 20s.

In 2019 he completed the Manchester half-marathon for the second time and was awarded the Changing Lifestyles trophy at **Rochdale Borough Sports** and Culture Awards and was a finalist in the Greater Manchester Sports Awards.

The member of VIC lost his wife Doreen, who had dementia, in October, but he said the veteran family has helped him to cope.

Gordon, who is a regular at The Sandbag Café in Heywood, which VIC has now been able to reopen, said: "The veterans have been

brilliant with me and that is why I want my walking to raise money for them.

"I am very thankful for what they have done, they even brought me a full Christmas dinner on Christmas Day because my son was away and that was fantastic."

Gordon, who also walks with Milnrow Walking Group and Link 4 Life, has already completed 840 of the miles, including a little walk along the Rochdale Canal which ended up a 19.7 mile round trip.

VIC Chief Executive Amanda Walton said: "Gordon has done amazingly well and already he is over three quarters of the way through his challenge.

"He is raising money for Veterans In Communities through the walks and on Thursday July 1 he is asking people to join him. I will be going on the whole route while others will join him on stages.

"He is inspirational."

The walk in July will be from Hollingworth Lake and probably around five miles.

Gordon said: "I had prostate cancer and had radiotherapy which killed off the cancer, but it also damaged my immune system and left me without white blood cells.

"My doctor said I would not get it back, but I altered my diet and began eating healthier and keeping fit and I decided to try to prove him wrona.'

It worked and he is now only on six-month checks.

Gordon added: "I will be 86 in August, and I want to complete the 1,000-mile challenge by that date and then I want to get myself ready to complete the next Manchester halfmarathon, also to raise money for VIC."
