Tracey Vick

Tracey was a founding member of VIC and sadly lost her battle with cancer last month, aged 56.

Along with fiancé Darren Horsnell, Tracey joined VIC in 2011 when it was called Veterans In Action after they both attended a drop-in session at Haslingden Community Link. From then on, Darren



and Tracey have been an intrinsic part of VIC, Darren as Arts and Crafts Co-ordinator and Tracey as his soul mate, companion, supporter and attendee at many VIC activities.

She helped to organise fundraising events including the first Fun Day at St Mary's Football Club in Haslingden and was always by Darren's side at VIC events over the years.

Darren said: "We used to play about with each other on the same street in East London and I met her when I was 11 and she was nine.

"Our favourite place was Wanstead Flats - a park with a big lake and loads of cherry blossom and we would play kiss-chase. I will never forget those memories."

They were really good mates until one day Darren

IT IS with much sadness that we have to report the death of two members of VIC – Tracey Vick and Derek Cullen.

wrote Tracey a letter and in it he asked if she would go out with him and gave her a yes and no box to tick – she ticked yes.

At 13, Tracey moved to Rossendale with her family and Darren joined the army at 15, but they kept in touch by letter even when he was stationed in Belize.

They both married and Tracey had five children while Darren had three, then, thanks to a message from Friends Reunited, they met in 2000. A year later they were a couple again and Darren moved to live with Tracey in Rossendale.

Darren said: "We got back together when I was at my worst; I was in bits and I had already done so much to myself. She saved me; Tracey and VIC saved me.

"It was Tracey who got me to contact Combat Stress and while there I got into painting, then I joined VIC. Without her support, I wouldn't have done anything; I had to have her with me at all times.

"We went back to London and had a couple of picnics where we used to play. Tracey was such a genuine, honest, caring person who always put everyone else first."

She was ill last Christmas and in March a blood test indicated there was cancer, but COVID-19 meant it was several months before she received chemotherapy.

When she returned home from a hospital stay, she found a bench that had belonged to her late father had been lovingly restored by VIC and was in pride of place outside their home.

Darren said: "I thought we would never get the bench fixed, I had spent hours sanding it down, but then Tracey got ill. When she came home and saw it, she was absolutely made up. It was so nice of them to do it."

Her funeral was on October 5 and veterans and friends provided a socially distanced guard of honour for the cortege as it made its way from Tracey and Darren's home in Haslingden and on to Burnley Crematorium. Afterwards everyone met at the Green Squirrel.

IT IS nearly three years since we first helped out a young veteran who was bringing up his three young children alone having lost his wife to cancer.

Now VIC, along with other armed forces organisations and food groups, have stepped in again as the veteran has contracted COVID. Operations Manager Bob Elliott said: "We saw an appeal by VIC member Andy Holder on Burnley International Veterans' Social Club asking for food parcels for the young veteran and his family as he had to isolate after contracting COVID.

"We got food donations from Positive Start in Rawtenstall and also



from Asda Rawtenstall where community champion Laura Saxton put in Hallowe'en items for his children as the first time I met him his children were decorating the house for Hallowe'en." He also received donations from the food bank at Burnley FC in the Community.

"Graeme created the programme to specifically bring art to the masses and away from the perceived view that art was something available only to the privileged few."
